Oct 4 The Art of Living, The Art of Dying. LECTURE presented by Dr. Harsha Jayatilake

Does our cultural fear of dying interfere with our ability to maximize our potential for a full and meaningful life? There has been a trend in recent years to reexamine the notion that death is the grim reaper to be held at bay at all costs Around 25% of our health care dollars from Medicare are spent in the last year of life, and to what benefit? Social attitudes toward death are changing as we begin to recognize the severe limits of the medical system to offer health care solutions that restore meaningful quality of life once death stands on the horizon. Surely, there are better ways.

Oct 11 Where do we go after death? LECTURE presented by Winnie Wylie

Where do we go after death? According to medieval alchemists, it is to the astral plane. Charles Leadbeater, in his book, *The Astral Plane*, says that most of us are awake on the astral plane while we are asleep on the physical plane.
