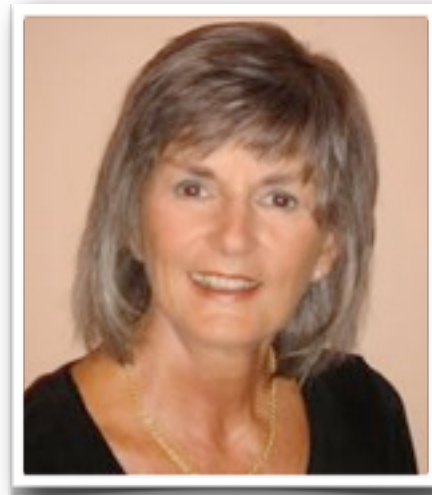

Healing the Dying, Healing Ourselves

Dying is a natural part of life, and yet we know little about helping our loved ones through this process, and know even less of how to prepare ourselves for this inevitable transition. This workshop is intended for anyone who ever was or will be touched by the death of a loved one. We will focus on the ways the caregiver's presence helps to facilitate the transition process we know as death. Using exercises and discussion, we will learn how to use our Inner Self to heal the dying and to heal ourselves, a skill that will be of value throughout life.

Dr. Nelda Samarel, a long-time student of theosophy, has been Director of the Krotona School of Theosophy and District Director for the Theosophical Society in America. A retired professor of nursing, she presents internationally and has numerous publications, including the Theosophical Order of Service booklet, *Helping the Dying: A Guide for Families and Friends Assisting Those in Transition*.

Directions: Sulphur Springs is located in the Ozarks of Northwest Arkansas, on State Road 59, 2 miles south of the Missouri State Line, 9 miles east of Oklahoma State Line -a scenic drive by car through forests and fields. Flights to this area arrive at the new Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport, which is less than 30 miles away. Sulphur Springs is a small, beautiful town in Northwest Arkansas. Hiway 59 goes through town right by the city park. Take Colony Street going east which is just on the north side of the bridge over Butler Creek. Go about one block and turn left, staying on Colony Street. Go about 0.2 mile and you will see a road fork off to the right. Take the road to the right and continue all the way into the camp. There is no street sign for Skyline Drive, but we will try to have a direction sign at that point.

Fayetteville/Bentonville Northwest Arkansas Regional Airport serves this area, about 35 miles from Camp, Coordinate with Nancy Blott (405-412-1971)if you need a pick-up and return to airport.
