The Federation welcomes **Kurt Leland** as the presenter for the annual **2013 Spring Convention** (details in adjacent column). Kurt is a researcher in consciousness



studies and intuitive consultant from Boston. His Convention presentation is entitled:

## Cosmic Songs: Consciousness and Invisible Worlds.

Kurt is author of five books. In his latest *The Multidimensional Human*, (2010) he gives insights on psychic development based on personal experience. He is also a musician and composer and in his book, *Music and the Soul* (2004) he gives guidance in using music to enhance mystical states of consciousness.

Kurt spontaneously began having out-of-body experiences, (astral projections), as a teenager. Though fearful at first, after finding the written works of other out-of-body experiencers, he became a researcher himself. In 2005 he came across Theosophist, Annie Besant's book *Man and His Bodies* and discovered that her own and other Theosophical material on the various bodies (etheric double, astral, mental, causal and Ego) as well as the Planes correlated with his personal experiences of these other realms. Kurt's investigations nicely satisfy Theosophy's Third Object, to explore the hidden powers latent in humanity.

At the Federation Convention Kurt will share the results of forty years of inner and outer exploration of the subtle bodies and planes. Also he will help us explore our spiritual depths through Transcendental Musical Experiences.

# In the Spotlight The Miami Lodge at Deerfield

Florida has twelve Theosophical lodges and study centers (list on previous page). The Miami Lodge at Deerfield is the most active group in Florida and also one of the most active in the United States.

This Lodge has several different classes on every day of the week, year round, with some 23 different teachers who are all members of the Lodge and of the Theosophical Society in America. The Lodge's July–September flier lists such classes as The Ageless Wisdom; The Secret Doctrine; The Bhagavad Gita; The 12 Labors of Hercules; Meditation; Exercises in Awareness, Studies in the Tarot, Pantanjali Yoga Sutras; The Course in Miracles; The Gift of Mystic Poetry, and many more.

The Lodge is the oldest in Florida, still in existence with a charter dated February 9, 1919 and signed by then International President, Annie Besant.

In February 1919, a Mr. and Mrs. Hanchett, who gave lectures though out the U.S., came to Miami and rented the auditorium of the Woman's Club for three evenings to give Theosophical lectures. Mrs. Hanchett reported that they had gone to Miami, The Magic City and rented the auditorium on faith, not knowing that there was a single Theosophist in the city.

The lectures were well advertised and the first evening the hall was packed and many turned away. From those lectures, the Lodge was founded with 19 members, many of whom were deep students of Theosophy and had belonged to lodges in other places.

During the 1920s and 30s the membership of the Lodge rose and fell from a high of 66 in 1932 to a low of 34 in 1934. In the 1960s through the 1980s the membership stayed around 50.

Through the years the Lodge members met in various places, and in 1960 they bought a garage apartment in Miami and renovated it to serve as a meeting space and a bookstore. By the end of the 1980s the membership dropped to a low of 30 for various reasons and then the leadership decided it would be best to move. For many years they looked for a suitable location in Miami that the lodge could afford. It was in 1993 that the opportunity came for them to move to their current location in Deerfield Beach. They had a benefactor who loaned the lodge the money for the down payment. They were able to sell their Miami property in time to close the Deerfield deal and reimburse the benefactor. It was a good move and the lodge is thriving in its new location.

#### The Miami Lodge at Deerfield's Famous Son, John Algeo

Former National President and former International Vice President, John Algeo got his start in Theosophy through the Miami Lodge. In 1947 when he was 16 years old he started confirmation classes at a local Catholic Church. In the course of his reading in the Parish Library he came upon a series of booklets on "dangerous heresies," which were intended to warn the faithful against what the good Jesuit Fathers thought was wickedness One of the little booklets was on Theosophy. John says that he read it and thought to himself, "My goodness, but that sounds interesting." A few weeks after that he noticed an ad about a meeting of the Theosophical Society and decided to see for himself what the dangerous heretics looked like up close. He was given the book *Elementary Theosophy* by L. W. Rogers and that book sold him on Theosophy. John says, his story has a moral: "We should not worry about critical comments and unfair reports, or about being called names and misunderstood. Those who are seeking will find in whatever reports come their way that which they need to find. Truth is great and will prevail over and even out of falsehood."

Resurgence of the St Petersburg Lodge: The conference announced below with Ed Abdill is a big step to rejuvenate the St. Petersburg Lodge, chartered in 1919 by Annie Besant. The Lodge nearly closed last year. Members from the Spanish-speaking Tampa-Besant Study Center, lead by Armando Santana, and the Bradenton Study Center joined forces with remaining St. Petersburg members in a concerted revitalization effort. Federation President Judith Snow-Clewell leads this coalition with assistance from the Theosophical Society in America in Wheaton.
