Algeo, John, Senzar: The Mystery of the Mystery Language, 1988, 32 pages.

According to Blavatsky, Senzar is the original language of the Stanzas of Dzyan which form the basis of *The Secret Doctrine*. Dr. Algeo analyses the nature of this mysterious language based on Blavatsky's writings.

Argus, A Voyage of Discovery in The Secret Doctrine: A Centennial Homage, c1988, 134 pages.

A collection of essays on some fundamental teachings found in *The Secret Doctrine*, many of which are compared with those of Western philosophers and modern scientific theories.
