The author states that meditation on symbols is a particular form of Yoga and offers in this book a study in symbology—focusing especially on the one presented by Mme. Blavatsky in *The Secret Doctrine*—as a means of conveying metaphysical concepts.

A classic of Theosophical literature, this book contains a series of letters written during the early years of the Theosophical Society by two Eastern sages, the Adepts known as Koot Hoomi and Morya who were Mme. Blavatsky's teachers. This edition arranges the letters in their chronological sequence.

Using the metaphor of a Temple as the goal of human evolution, the author describes the phases of preparation essential to entrance into the Inner Sanctum as well as the way of initiation to be trodden once there.

Besant, Annie, *The Masters*, 1985, 54 pages.

Besant talks about perfected beings, the final products of human evolution, providing historical evidence of their existence and the testimony found in mythology and religion. She explains what the Masters are, where they live, their place in evolution, and their work.

Besant, Annie, The Path of Discipleship, 1980, 153 pages.

Tracing the steps on the Path that leads to perfection, Besant begins with the daily life of the ordinary aspirant, explaining the moral and spiritual qualifications needed to become a disciple of a Master of Wisdom, and describing how the life of a disciple is lived.

Burnier, Radha, No Other Path to Go, c1985, 87 pages.

According to the Upanishads the spiritual path is like "the sharp edge of a razor, difficult to cross and hard to tread." This book describes the nature of the path and the pitfalls encountered thereon.

Burnier, Radha, *The Way of Self-Knowledge*, 1980, 31 pages.

Self-knowledge is necessary for every aspirant in the spiritual life if it will lead to wisdom and unity. The author explores how to work with the psychological aspect of our nature in order to awaken spiritual perception.

Codd, Clara, The Technique of the Spiritual Life, 1985, 125 pages.

Codd describes preparation for the spiritual journey, purification and training of the body, emotions and mind, and explains the actual treading of the Path and its method.

Codd, Clara, *The Way of the Disciple*, 1974, 322 pages.

A thorough presentation of the "path of discipleship" according to theosophical literature, covering subjects like the nature of the Adept, preparation for the aspirant, and qualifications for initiation.

Collins, Mabel, *Light on the Path*, 1944, 111 pages.

First published in 1885, and today considered a spiritual classic, this book contains in a few profound sentences, valuable instructions for those who would tread the path of discipleship. This edition also includes comments written by the author, and an article entitled *Karma*.

Collins, Mabel, *Through the Gates of Gold*, 1913, 124 pages.

The author portrays the journey of the aspirant on the way towards the Gates of Gold, illustrating the steps necessary to reach their threshold, and how going through them will lead to Reality.

Cooper, Irving S., *Methods of Psychic Development*, 1923, 113 pages.

A serious and complete outline of the subject, examining the different levels of psychic abilities, their place in human evolution, the dangers and potentialities of methods usually advised to develop them, and the safe path towards an integral evolution of the inner man.

Hanson, Virginia, *Masters and Men: The Human Story in the Mahatma Letters*, c1980, 323 pages.

A story set in an historical framework dealing with real people and events that took place in the fascinating early years of the Theosophical Society, where letters from Mme. Blavatsky's Adept teachers were being received by some of its members.

Hao Chin, Vicente, *The Process of Self-Transformation: Mastery of the Self and Awakening of our Higher Potentials*, c2003, 260 pages.

Using awareness as its basic tool, this book details procedures to handle psychological conflicts like fears, depression, worries and stress, conflicts which could prevent ones capacity to live more fully as well as to deepen ones spiritual practice.
