DREAMS ARE FOREVER

Have perseverance as one who doth for evermore endure. — The Voice of the Silence

How does a person remain an optimist despite having endured repeated setbacks and even outright failure while attempting to realize his or her innermost dreams? Blavatsky's *Voice of the Silence* provides some poignant words of encouragement for all sincere aspirants: "If thou hast tried and failed, O dauntless fighter, yet lose not courage; fight on and to the charge return again, and yet again." If we lived only one brief lifetime on this earth, such fine sounding words would be of limited value.
